Whether you're interested in visiting a sumo wrestling match, dipping into a hot spring bath (onsen), attending a traditional kabuki performance or simply enjoying the ambiance of a local izakaya, Japanese hospitality will inspire you to fully immerse yourself in the rich culture and customs of Japan.

The sprawling capital city of Tokyo unfolds on Honshu's southern coast. An eclectic mix of districts results in a unique city that blends the skyscrapers of a futuristic metropolis with the temples, shrines, and Imperial Palaces of a traditional landscape.

Travel back in time in Kyoto, the ancient capital until the late 19th century. Discover the pretty pathways. Japan is an all-year-round destination, given its distinctive four seasons and unique archipelago, comprising of four main islands, and thousands of smaller ones. With such vast reach from subarctic to subtropical zones, Japan forms a magical, diverse island nation with varying cultures and climates throughout. This island, spanning from subarctic to subtropical zones, results in a magical, diverse island nation with varying climates and cultures throughout.



Spring

March blooms come to life first in the Ryukyu, Kyushu, and Shikoku Islands, thanks to the warmer climates in southwestern Japan. The blossoms then gradually extend northwards, reaching mountainous regions, Tohoku, and Hokkaido later in spring, with their vibrant display continuing into May.

The most common variety, Somei-Yoshino, spreads plumes of pale pink blossoms, while the weeping cherry trees, Shidare-Zakura, drape elegantly along riverbanks. Enjoy Sakura viewing parties in parks, sites, and cities. Allow extra time to plan your trip for travel at this time.



Summer

July, August, and September mark Japan's hottest months, characterised by high humidity and temperatures soaring to nearly 40°C in some regions. Fortunately, most places are equipped with air conditioning, so it's essential to be prepared for the cold indoors. The traditional rainy season typically occurs in late June or early July, though its predictability has become erratic in recent years. Planning your trip around this season may be challenging due to its unpredictable nature. Some of our best summer tours include Shikoku Secrets, Wonders of the West, Hokkaido Blooms, Hidden Treasures, and Ancient Trails.



Autumn

Scorching summers subside into vibrant shades of orange in this poetic season. Foliage first begins to turn on the northern island of Hokkaido in mid-September. Leaves can change colour in Tokyo and Kyoto from mid-October through to early December, while the best viewing occurs around mid-November. The intense red maple leaves are named Momiji and foraging for them is a customary practice. Koyo describes the red and yellow coloured foliage. Visit during this wonderful time to stroll through blazing shades in city parks, on mountainous hiking trails, or view the passing spectacle from the train windows.



Winter

Snow transforms the northern regions of Japan into a paradise for ski and snowboard enthusiasts. In the rest of Japan, winter is characterised by warm lights, crackling fires, cozy corners, and often clear blue skies. Don't let the cold deter you, as this season is considered one of the most delightful times to visit Japan. With fewer tourists, you can enjoy more space and a serene atmosphere in the often-overcrowded popular places.



Sleep...

Traditional Ryokans

Staying in a ryokan serves as the ideal introduction to Japanese hospitality, showcasing the subtle gestures that effortlessly make guests feel at ease. The decor exudes typical Japanese aesthetics, where you sleep on a futon atop rice straw mat flooring (tatami). Indulge in traditional cuisine (kaiseki), and, in many cases, access public or private onsen (hot spring baths). Private onsens can be arranged in some ryokans. Some ryokans offer western beds in a small number of rooms.

Local Minshuku

Resembling a local guesthouse, a Minshuku is typically a family home or a smaller type of ryokan, often providing more basic meals and facilities. It offers a more economical choice compared to a ryokan, though it's important to note that the owners may not speak English. Minshukus are commonly utilised while exploring the more rural areas of Japan. Similar to ryokans, accommodations involve sleeping on a futon on tatami matted flooring, and traditional Japanese breakfast and dinner are served in the communal dining area.


Boutique Hotels

Western Hotels

Hotels are generally of very high standard. Instead of Europe's star system, they are categorised as Super Deluxe (6*) Deluxe (5*), Superior (4*) and Standard (3*). Combining all types of accommodation standards into your trip offers a well-balanced diverse experience.

Getting Around...

Bullet Trains (Shinkansen)

Bullet trains, also known as Shinkansen in Japan, are a part of a high-speed rail network that has become an iconic symbol of Japan's technological prowess and efficiency in transportation. The Shinkansen represents not only a mode of transportation but a testament to Japan's ability to push technological boundaries, enhance connectivity, and shape the way people perceive and experience rail travel. Spanning from north to southwest Japan, the network of shinkansens lines covers over 3,000km.

Japan Rail offers a special pass called the **Japan Rail Pass**. The value of the pass will depend on the journeys you plan to take inside Japan. **7**, **14**, **21 day passes** are available to have before you leave your home country. However, it is advisable not to rush into buying the pass without a clear understanding of your travel plans.

Chartered Vehicles

While Japan boasts excellent public transportation in cities and an exceptional taxi service, the luxury of being transferred from one location to another can undoubtedly save time. Once you venture beyond the cities, having a dedicated driver with you adds a touch of luxury and significantly simplifies your travel experience. As a nation with a proud auto industry, Japan ensures the highest quality of chartered vehicles for a seamless transportation experience.





Using Local Transport

Top Tips!

Despite the crowded nature of public transport in Japan, you will be surprised at how quiet the trains and buses will be.

Our recommended list of tips, when using public transport, including bullet trains, include:

- Buy a Suica or Pasmo Card to avoid having to pay for tickets each time. Buses, trains, and most transportations will accept this, including taxi's. Make sure it's kept topped up.
- Be prepared to walk a lot. Always wear comfortable shoes.
- Be respectful and quiet when using public transport.
- Join queues to board trains in a mannerly way. Never skip the queue.
- Do not talk on the phone on trains or buses. You can text and browse on your phone.
- Taxi doors are automatic so you don't need to open or close them.
- Assume your taxi driver won't speak English so have your destination address ready.
- Walk in the direction of the crowd, not against it.
 Pedestrian lanes are usually formed during busy times.
- If you bump into someone, say 'sumimasen' (excuse me) with a smile.
- Avoid eye contact. Most Japanese people are on their phone or reading a book.
- Avoid rush hour on busy commuter trains or subways (8-10am, 5-7pm) but if you can't, be prepared for a tight squeeze.
- Avoid eating food on trains or buses, especially if it has a strong smell.
- Eating on shinkansen's and long-distance express trains is allowed. In fact, you can buy snacks on board.
- Bring your trash with you or place inside the rubbish bins at train exit area. Don't leave on your seats.

In summary, when traveling throughout Japan, be respectful, courteous, and considerate of other people. This reflects a fundamental ethos in Japanese society.

Tokyo

Get into the Tokyo groove in the awesome epicentre of mega-city magic. In Shibuya, join people crisscrossing wide streets lined with illuminated towers of glass playing catchy rhymes, and displaying colourful images. Sample the life of locals in food halls, department stores and dining in a neighbourhood izakaya, raise a glass to say 'Kampai!' at your welcome dinner.

Nagano

Hop aboard the Hokuriku Shinkansen for a two-hour ride to Nagano. Elevate to the Yudanaka mountains filled with volcanic springs. After a 1.6km stroll through effervescent trees, watch playful monkeys pounce and cuddle their young when not dipping or sipping in the springs. Be warned, September and October months are mating season so the monkeys may be busy!

A warm *omotenashi* welcome awaits at a traditional inn in a nearby village. Kaiseki dinner and onsen spring-fed baths are a highlight to savour. Local wines (sake) are a great pairing with this delicate meal. Dress in traditional Yukata to relax in rooms with comfortable tatami flooring.

Matsumoto and Takayama

The mighty Matsumoto Castle rises above a sprawling city trimmed with mountain peaks. In the evening arrive at Takayama. The next day, join a vivacious guide to explore the seasonal treats offered along the river at a morning market worth getting up for. Stop into an Edo-era merchant house to sample a collection of local goods and snacks. Look out for giant Torii gates and bright red bridges. The delicate texture and taste of Hida beef is a must-try at restaurants set in old distilleries. These warehouse settings are filled with grill smoke, sweet sake and smiling faces.



Gokayama and Kanazawa

Connect with the past at a UNESCO World Heritage Site, famous for its rare and rustic Gassho Zukkuri 300-year-old thatched roof farmhouses. At this remote village of Gokayama, learn how to make soba (buckwheat) noodles and washi paper craft. In Kanazawa, visit Kenrokuen Garden; one of Japan's three Great Gardens. Visit the Higashi Chaya district for a traditional tea ceremony.

Kyoto

The dimly lit evening streets of entertainment areas bring life to the quiet corners of this city. Beloved Kyoto, once the imperial heart of Japan, subtly reveals its treasures, offering unexpected delights at every turn.

Ready for a brief encounter with a special class of cultural treasure. The Maiko or trainee Geisha has committed to diligent training in music, dance, entertaining games and conversation whilst adhering to a precise dress code and elaborate white make-up. Consider what questions you will ask her when you join her for tea.

Visit some amazing locations nearby on your free day such as Nara; the first capital of Japan, Kobe; one of the first ports to open to foreign trade, or Osaka; the culinary capital of Japan famous for its sensational street food.

Hiroshima and Miyajima Island

Journey west in comfort on a two-hour Shinkansen ride to Hiroshima. Guided through the city, know more about the tragic history and humble resilience. Be captivated by the famous red Torii gates floating on the coast. Enter the stunning island to explore the curious Itsukushima shrine's various sites around this magical place and spiritual island.

Mt. Fuji and Hakone

The bullet train eastwards offers a first look at Mt. Fuji; Japan's most sacred peak that sits north of the country retreat Hakone, nestled amidst the Fuji Hakone National Park; a UNESCO Natural Heritage site. Relax once again in traditional style at a ryokan with onsen bathing and kaiseki dinner. Admire Mt Fuji from many angles before completing your shopping and sightseeing bucket list back in Tokyo.



Tokyo

Settle in with sake and delicious bites in the old village of Edo. Join the night revellers on the streets of Shibuya or Shinjuku after a lively welcome dinner at a local Izakaya. Shop in centuries old Asakusa arcade which leads to a popular Buddhist temple. Tokyo Skytree peers down as Hamarikyu garden nestles in under skyscraper filled skies. At Tsukiji outer market, shop for kitchenware and sample fresh sushi.

Nagano & Matsumoto

Fresh cider filled air surrounds the Yudanaka Onsen area. Stop by to see snow monkeys who frolic and relax in the natural hot springs. Immerse in the Japanese Alps with a stop at the vibrant Matsumoto, with a majestic samurai castle central to city pride.

Takayama

Takayama's preserved buildings and streets are an idyllic setting for an inviting morning market filled with the freshest of local goods and plenty of tasty bites and exquisite delights. Visit Takayama Jinya, the merchant home and local town hall since Tokugawa times. 16th-century festival floats can be viewed at the Takayama Yatai Kaikan (Festival Float Hall), the impressive festival in April and October.

Gokayama & Kanazawa

Tread into the heart of Japan's pastoral heritage at Gokayama, a World Heritage site where the Gassho-zukuri farmhouses rise like hands in prayer to the heavens. In this secluded hamlet, time-honoured practices are not just preserved but are a way of life. Engage in the art of soba noodle making, feel the texture of washi paper, and share moments of warmth around the hearth with local farmers, their stories will remain cherished moments of your journey.

Kenrokuen Garden in Kanazawa is a canvas of natural artistry, one of Japan's three Great Gardens, where each season paints a new masterpiece. The city, reverently dubbed "Little Kyoto," captivates with its Higashi Chaya district; a quarter where the pastel hues of geisha houses sit in delicate contrast to the tea ceremony's lush backdrop. Known for its fresh sushi given its coastal location, the city also boasts several world-class art museums.



Kyoto

Kyoto is a living museum, a repository of Japan's heart and history. Its streets, a labyrinth of the past. Here, the Maiko, in their kaleidoscopic kimonos, are not just a sight to behold but a tradition pulsing with life. Their performances are an intricate ballet of culture and artistry, revealing the layers of a city that once ruled as the emperor's seat. On your free day, you might continue touring Kyoto city at your own pace or perhaps delve deeper into Japan's soul by visiting Nara's ancient splendours, or opt for a jaunt on the bullet train to Hiroshima and Miyajima Island.

Amami Ooshima

Discover the enchanting Amami Oshima, an idyllic isle where tropical dreams are painted in strokes of golden sunsets and azure waters. A jewel in the Pacific, this hidden paradise boasts pristine beaches and lush rainforests. The island's essence is captured not just in the hammock-swaying ease of resort life but also in the vibrant tapestry of its marine life, seen through the lens of a glass-bottom boat or the tranquil glide of a canoe through mangroves. 

Kobe

Fukuoka

Unzen Onsen

Retreat to Unzen Onsen, a geothermally heated volcanic hot spring resort, said to be good for beautifying skin. Overnight at a traditional ryokan with Kaiseki dining and a dip in volcanic hot springs melds rejuvenation with culinary artistry.

Kumamoto

Kumamoto's resplendent castle and historical residences, including those of Hosokawa and Lafcadio Hearn, frame a narrative of samurai honour and literary legacy. Excursions to Mt. Aso and Takachiho Gorge, alongside spiritual visits to Amano Iwato, enrich the journey with natural splendour.

Yakushima Island

On Yakushima, giant cedar forests await exploration, revealing ancient thousand-year-old cedars and lush landscapes. Jomonsugi, the largest of the cedar trees on the island, is estimated to be 2000-7200 years old. Beautiful beaches, hikes, and turtle watching above or below water is observed between May and August.

Tokyo

Both Pilgrimages share a dual certification system, if stamp collecting is your hobby. A wonderful way to embrace Japan's natural beauty and local communities.

Hokkaido's largest city is a fusion of modernity and heritage, definitely Japanese and yet distinctly different from cities in Honshu. Feel the pulsating energy on snow sculpture-lined streets as the city captivates your spirit.



Kushiro

In the serene marshlands of Kushiro, witness the poetic grace of the Red-Crowned Cranes, an emblem of nature's elegance and Japan's commitment to preserving its natural heritage. This region, where mist rises off the marshes like a soft veil, offers a sanctuary not only for these iconic birds but also for the soul seeking tranquillity. Beyond its ecological allure, Kushiro acts as a portal to the wild, inviting explorers to its misty lakes and vast reserves, where whispers of the earth's ancient past can be heard in silence.



Akan Mashu National Park




Takayama Festival

Twice a year an impressive parade winds through the preserved streets of Takayama, featuring elaborate 16th-century floats, which are UNESCO treasures. Mikoshi portable shrines are rolled out of a huge purpose-built warehouse, Takayama Yatai Kaikan (Festival Float Hall). They are ornate, embellished with gems, draped cloth, gold bars, and symbolic designs. The top is crowned with figures of the phoenix and demons. One shrine features a tortoise character, and another a marionette with 36 strings. The Karako moves like an acrobat, before landing on the god of good fortune, Hotei-sama, who then sprays confetti over the surprised crowd below.

Cormorant Fishing with Dinner

Rickshaw Ride by Arashiyama Bamboo Grove

Kyoto's Arashiyama district to the west of the ancient city has been a popular destination with nobles since the Heian Period (794-1185). Climb onboard for a memorable ride through a verdant bamboo grove to see the tall trees sway. Dizzy with tree-top gazing stroll the path of strong sticks, as you wade and bathe in the forest light. Then stop at Tenryuji Temple or glide over Togetsukyo Bridge. The challenge is to choose which way to go, the rest is a breeze.

Abashiri Drift-Ice Cruise

(subject to conditions)

The most southern region of the northern hemisphere is located in the Sea of Okhotsk, from Wakkanai to the Shiretoko Peninsula in Hokkaido. Ice is more likely to be thicker in the areas close to Abashiri. From Abashiri Port take an hour-long cruise out into the Sea of Okhotsk. Bob along, mesmerized, as the boat carves a passage through thick ice, emerging like glaciers. Vessels crunch and slice through the frozen seas as ice floats and drifts away. This is an invigorating way to experience the phenomenal ice drift. Warm up on shore after being amazed at this natural wonder.




Canoe through a Virgin Mangrove Forest in Amami Oshima

Glide under an arch of line-leaved branches in this natural ecosystem vibrant with life. Transverse the labyrinth of channels, paddle in the unique biodiversity of Amami to observe endemic animals from the water. Subtropical estuaries and coastal tidal flats grow a variety of plants, forming the second-largest mangrove forest in Japan. Flooded by tides, this is the only place in the world to find Ryukyu Ayu fish, who hide out in the basketed roots at the base of the mangroves. Low tide is a paradise for crabs and in Mangrove Park glimpse white- coloured Black Herons camouflaged by white sand.

Spin around Omishima Island on Electric Bikes

Northwest of Shikoku, adventure in nature on a 70 km route stretching from Ehime to Hiroshima. Shimanami Kaido is surrounded by sea, mountains, and blue skies in a sun-drenched prefecture. Start at the foot of the Kurushima Kaikyo Bridge to cycle along three successive suspension bridges over the Kurushima Strait, and feel the breeze 65 meters above the sea. Follow blue lines along the road that mark the route. Cycle hybrid or e-bikes to reach Omishima Island, then choose to turn back or continue to Onomichi. Refresh with local citrus fruits or a visit to the historic Dogo hot springs.

Indigo Dyeing Workshop

Aizome, or indigo dyeing, is a traditional craft to dye cloth with leaves from the Japanese indigo plant trade, one of the oldest plant dyes which arrived in Japan 1400 years ago. This technique is admired and adapted by many with an interest in textiles and making cloth unique and distinctive. Indigo dye is used extensively for batik and shibori. Samurai wore indigo to prevent wound infections. It is also insect-repelling; odour-preventing and has an antibacterial agent. Take home a self-designed hand-dyed handkerchief as a memento.

Make Washi Paper

Experts take mush and magically make it transform into paper. From the pulp of Kozo mulberry trees, a transparent liquid solidifies in layers to reveal a template for design. Strengthened from the tree fibres the paper is more durable and substantial. Winter is traditionally a time to make washi with frozen water free from impurities. Add fallen leaves or seasonal flowers to enliven the plain sheet of Washi. As it dries it becomes a real piece of thick paper, ready to be stamped and painted with words of wisdom, then displayed on walls in lands near and far




Samurai Castles

The Ainu Kotan, or settlement at Lake Akan is inhabited by about 120 people. See an authentic performance featuring traditional dress, language, and sacred epic dances. Meet the local Ainu people and observe master crafts of intricate wood carvings of bears and birds, produced, and sold on site. The Ainu dances, renowned 'yukar' oral sagas, are Hokkaido's only designated important intangible Cultural Heritage of Japan. Ainu finds that by using Inau, a ritual wooden tool that represents the Kamuy Gods, they can express truth in song, dance and prayers, and go beyond barriers that hamper people from conveying their true feelings.

Kimono Production Outlet for Tsumugi Textiles in Amami Oshima

Observe the many steps to weave and dye Oshima Tsumugi, a textile of sombre colours, perfectly suited to the local climate. The detailed process of hand-spun silk can take three months to make, and the raw materials used for dyeing are extracted from a plant called *tecchigi* native to the Amami area. It is counted among the world's three most famous silk textiles. The elegant and distinctive appearance has made it one of the best Kimono textiles in Japan. The fabric is lightweight yet warm, not easily wrinkled or worn and endures even after generations inherit the Kimono.

Endangered Red-Crowned Crane Sanctuary

A magical sun rises over Hokkaido, as hundreds of red-crowned cranes gather by Setsuri River. Usually found painted on scrolls and ceramics, these iconic birds are protected in Kushiro Shitsugen, a sanctuary constructed to encourage the repopulation of this rare breed. They breed in marshy meadows and wetlands and spend the winter in fields, marshes, and other open areas. The enclosed nature in this sanctuary provides a perfect chance to photograph the birds up close and seize the moment to take in a northern sunrise in the company of the majestic Tancho Cranes.


Sub-Tropical Japan Yakushima and Amami Ooshima

Heian courts connect lakes by bridges. A large empty area of sand and Zen brings the simple, spontaneous and modern to unique Japanese Gardens.

Japanese Macaque (Snow) Monkeys

In Nagano, enjoy a short hike up the mountainside to discover the natural habitat of a community of interesting snow. A protected species also known as the snow monkeys are known for their expressive facial features and playful expressions. In adulthood, their faces and bottoms become red. Get to know their personalities, cheeky and obedient, as you observe how they interact with each other in the warm natural springs of Yudanaka onsen in Joshinetsu National Park. Lakes and National Parks of Hokkaido

The volcanic activity of the Chishima Volcanic Zone created Akan-Mashu National Park. Composed of three caldera landforms the Akan Caldera, Kussharo Caldera, and Mashu Caldera. Covered in a coniferous forest of Yezo spruce, Sakhalin fir and Erman's birch. With several volcano-lakes, the Akan area includes Mt. Me-akan and Mt. O-akan overlooking Lake Akan and Lake Onneto. In the Mashu (Kawayu) area, see one of the most transparent lakes in the world Lake Mashu, as well as Lake Kussharo. Look out for the unusual plants called Moss Balls that grow in Lake Akan, now designated as a National Special Natural Monument.

Active Volcano at Unzen and Mt Aso

This beautiful National Park has been a summer retreat for foreign visitors since 1889, protected nature flourishes in all seasons in the eight mountains collectively called Mount Unzen. Japan's First National Park since 1934 has been protected since ancient times. Discover wild birds and highland plants, seasonal sweeps of colour and the natural therapeutic properties of acidic springs at an early Meiji-era resort. Mount Aso, situated in Kyushu, is Japan's largest active volcano and a key attraction in the prefecture. A prime destination for hiking and sightseeing, it is part of the Aso Kuju National Park. With its peak towering at 1,592 meters above sea level, Mount Aso offers a breathtaking mountainside view from Aso city.

Kumano Kodo

The Kumano Kodo, ancient pilgrimage routes leading to the three Grand Shrines of Kumano (Kumano Hayatama Taisha Grand Shrine, Kumano Hongu Taisha Grand Shrine, and Kumano Nachi Taisha Grand Shrine), have held UNESCO World Heritage status since 2004. Gain enlightenment of the ages along the 10km Nakahechi section. Remote and mystical, wind through the peaceful countryside on a one-day hike. Follow a mountain trail from Takijiri-oji shrine by Tonda River to pause in the village of Takahara, a small ridge-top settlement. Capture the mountain range wrapped in mist, like a sea of clouds in the valley below. Then pass Oji shrines to descend into Chikatsuyu village. Reach Tsugizakura-oji having absorbed the rich historical and spiritual atmosphere. Complete the full five-day Kumano Kodo route to reach Kumano Sanzan, the three Grand Shrines.

Q: How much free time can we expect?

In the event the final number of guests is less than 6, don't worry, we will not cancel your trip. Instead, we operate them on a semi-escorted basis. TRAVEL INSURANCE

SPENDING MONEY & CASH

Japan's currency is the Japanese Yen (¥). We recommend you have a minimum of ¥60,000 (€400) per person in cash at the start of your tour. While most services will accept credit cards as payment, there may be some smaller vendors who won't. So cash is important to carry. More information will be emailed to guests prior to departure in your travel pack and app.

LUGGAGE

When taking a bullet train on any of our small group tours, we will arrange to send your large suitcase from one hotel to the next. One suitcase per person is included. If you wish to send extra luggage in this way, you will be asked to pay locally. Depending on where we are sending your luggage to/from, you may need to pack an overnight bag. So, it is essential you have a smaller bag to pack a one or two night stay while your large case is en-route. A small backpack or in-flight suitcase will work (up to 10kg).
